Research Interests

Dr. Bray's current research focuses on working with non-profits and other community-based organizations to quantify their impact using individual- and community-level indicators of success. His work in this area includes the development of processes to assist groups and organizations in developing organic measures embedded into their existing business practices, especially those that illuminate elements of collective impact. At the community level, Dr. Bray focuses on the development of multidimensional indicators for quality of life and disparities in quality of life. His index work has included the development of a Hunger Index for the North Texas Food Bank and a Childhood Wellbeing Index for the Dallas Foundation, as well as a variety of needs assessment indices for non-profits around North Texas.

He was instrumental in the Institute's launch of the Wholeness Index, a comprehensive index of disparities in quality of life that taps 12 key dimensions of social dislocation. These dimensions are representative of those identified in academic literature and, more importantly, were vetted through representatives of the underserved communities in Dallas. Also, Dr. Bray's research includes the development and application of hierarchical models to explain variation in neighborhood levels of social dislocations, including assessing and controlling for spatial dependence in the data.

Dr. Bray's teaching interests include issues of social change, quantitative methodology, and the Urban Issues Workshop, which pairs advanced doctoral students from many fields in the social sciences with community organizations who need assistance with research. He works closely with graduate and undergraduate students in a variety of projects and serves on several dissertation committees. His teaching includes professional development, as well, with several courses developed for non-profit professionals.
